


What is the Safe Harbor Law?

UTAH CODE 53-5A-501

The Safe Harbor Law allows a cohabitant (someone aged 18 or older living in the same home) to voluntarily surrender a firearm to law enforcement for temporary safekeeping if they believe someone in the household poses an immediate threat to themselves or others.

Committing Your Firearm

When you bring your firearm(s) to the Police Department, please make sure it is unloaded and leave the firearm(s) in your vehicle.

We will help you to ensure that you understand this law and the procedure.

Please come prepared with a photo ID and the firearm(s) info : type, make, model, caliber and serial number.

Once we have gathered the necessary information, an officer will accompany you to collect the firearm(s) to store them temporarily.

Retrieving Your Firearm

We will hold your firearm for 90 days. You can request an extension for a second 90-day period.

You can request your firearm back at any time during the 90-day period.

You will be required to complete a firearm packet and pass a background check. You may be required to provide proof of ownership.

The evidence technician will contact you once the process is complete and let you know the results.

Pick-up is done by appointment only.
